Covid-19 / Corona

A general lockdown was instituted in Sri Lanka at an early stage. As a result of this and also due to the source and contact investigation and the mandatory quarantine, the number of Covid-19 infections in Sri Lanka is relatively small and fortunately there are few deaths.

The lockdown has had a significant impact on families living on a daily income, especially those with the disabled.

Because the family members could not work and thus could not generate income, the people were in dire need of money and faced with food shortages.

With the help of the Mullai foundation, an initiative has been set up to look at what rights disabled people have, whose families are affected by Covid-19. Questions have been asked about this to qualified government and non-government employees. In this way it became clear what the rights and possibilities of disabled people are, how they are extended and which authorities can be approached to make use of them.

All this prompted - for the first time - to organize a meeting with the help of governmental and non-governmental organizations and the Mullai Foundation for people who did not know where and from whom they could get help to provide for their daily needs.



The people who attended on September 29 indicated that they had received an answer to many of their questions and that they were therefore relieved. They see light again at the end of the tunnel. Because this meeting was such a success, similar meetings have also been organized in other villages.

Besides co-organizing this information meeting, the Mullai Foundation also has

be able to offer help in another way. At the request of the pastor of Mullaitivu to support people with disabilities in the context of the emergency relief campaign, we made a donation to help 50 people.

At the beginning of 2018, we started collecting second-hand items such as PCs, PC accessories, laptops, clothing, toys, tools, musical instruments, etc., which are packed in boxes and then shipped to Sri Lanka. This promotion is still ongoing. And with success! We receive a lot of support from Kusters education and training B.V. in Venray.
